

SWIM ENGLAND SOUTH EAST REGION WATER POLO UNDER 16 (2008 & YOUNGER) INTER REGION CHAMPIONSHIPS LIVERPOOL AQUATIC CENTRE 1ST & 2ND JULY 2023

For the boys born in 2008 the covid pandemic denied them the opportunity of playing in the under 14 inter region event that should have taken place and the end of 2020.

As a result, this under 16 competition was the first opportunity to play in an inter region event for several of the squad who were selected after several training sessions that took place over the past few months.

Normally the result of the under 14 event decides who plays in the two divisions of the under 16 competition.

Because the under 14 competition was not played all the regions (along with Scotland and Wales) took part in the tournament with the teams divided initially into two groups of five teams.

The South East were drawn in group B and would play matches on Saturday, which would be 2 x 8-minute periods, against East, North East, South West, and Wales.

Saturday 14.00

The opening match was the first of several close games where we came from behind to secure a tough win against a decent opposition.

The Sunday matches to decide the final places are played as 4 x 8-minute quarters and we knew that this longer format would potentially be very demanding on all the squad and this very much proved to be the case.

Unfortunately, the Scots had other ideas and eventually they equalised shortly before the end. We still had a chance to score in the final few seconds but the goal was disallowed and so we faced the excitement of a penalty shootout.

Will had been excellent in goal in all the previous matches and he came up with the crucial saves to secure the 3-2 win.

This was another terrific performance from the team in a tough and physical game which featured 29 exclusion fouls but overall, we did enough to book our place in the final.

Unfortunately, we did not have quite enough time in the match to overcome the deficit but it was a remarkable turnaround to lose the first quarter 1-9 and then win the remainder of the match 11-6. This was very much a case of what might have been, but we could not fault the squad for the way that they battled back into the match after such a disappointing start.
