## **Role and Expectation Outline**

#### **PURPOSE**

The overall purpose of the Regional Assistant Head Coach is to:

- Provide coaching support to the team under the guidance of the head coach
- Gain international coaching experience under the direction of the camp head coach
- Enhance coaching experience to allow progression to the role of head coach
- Assist with the delivery and evaluation of the camp
- Enhance communication with all team members
- Deliver all duties in accordance with the programme objectives and briefings
- Motivate and enthuse swimmers and staff during the programme
- Exhibit Aquatics GB and Swim England coaching principles; collaboration, evidence based, athlete centred whilst focusing on continuous coach development, inclusivity, and the pursuit of marginal gains.

#### **KEY RESPONSIBILITIES**

### Prior to programme delivery

- Liaise with the head coach to ensure you have an understanding of the aims and objectives of the camp/competition
- Ensure you have a clear understanding of your role during the duration of the camp
- Communicate with the head coach and other members of the camp staff/regional team
- Conduct timely and professional communication with the home coach of the athletes allocated to your group to help to form an understanding of the athletes' needs and expectations.
- Encourage athletes to prepare race process target sheets for their key races
- Complete any pre camp administration tasks in a timely manner

# **During programme delivery**

- Assist in the delivery of all camp/competition activity in line with the camp objectives and plans with the guidance of the head coach
- Support an allocated group of athletes
- Make a positive contribution as required to support land based activities.
- · Communicate effectively with all swimmers and staff
- Conduct effective pre-race planning with a focus on process targets
- Conduct effective post-Race evaluation, encouraging athlete self-reflection
- Support the team managers with the pastoral care of the athletes

## Following programme Delivery

- Reflect on camp delivery
- Contribute to the post camp debrief discussions led by the head coach
- Provide individual written feedback on each athlete to their home coach

- Must hold as a Swim England senior coach certificate or equivalent
- Must hold a valid Swim England DBS and safeguarding certificate
- Proven experience as a practising coach, working with British national level youth and senior swimmers.

- The ability to set priorities and work flexibly to meet outcomes required in a dynamic environment
- Good planning, interpersonal and communication skills
